



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/110

Food service and industrial pineapple

Exported from the Kingdom of Thailand by Prime Products Industry Co., Ltd

Findings in relation to an Accelerated Review of Anti-Dumping Measures

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, have completed the accelerated review, which commenced on 3 May 2015, of the anti-dumping measures applying to food service and industrial pineapple (FSI pineapple) exported to Australia from the Kingdom of Thailand by Prime Products Industry Co., Ltd (Prime Products).

Findings and recommendations were reported to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary) in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 295 (REP 295)*.

The Parliamentary Secretary has considered REP 295 and has accepted the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all material findings of fact or law set out in REP 295.

Under subparagraph 269ZG(3)(b)(ii) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), the Parliamentary Secretary declared that with effect from 3 May 2015, the Act and the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* (the Dumping Duty Act) have effect as if the original dumping duty notice had applied to Prime Products but the then Minister had fixed specified different variable factors relevant to the determination of duty payable by Prime Products.

The duty that has been determined is an amount worked out in accordance with the floor price duty method, as detailed in the table below. The dumping margin established for Prime Products is also set out in the table.

Exporter	Dumping Margin	Duty Method
Prime Products Industry Co., Ltd	-17.4%	Floor price duty method

Interim dumping duty will be payable on FSI pineapple exported by Prime Products only when the export price is below the floor price.
